



Spring 2010 Mini Survey Report

May 18, 2010

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INTRODUCTION

Fairfax Women's Soccer Association conducted a mini survey via Survey Monkey from 4/28/2010 through 5/13/2010. An email was sent to the team reps to pass along to team members with a link to the survey.

Because of some upcoming changes to our field usage and permits, the survey was conducted to determine member preferences. The survey also asked members about the possibility of implementing an online registration system

The survey collected 351 replies.

SUMMARY of FINDINGS

Requiring Payment through the Online System

49.6% said NO to being required to use the system to pay for registration fees

Of those who said NO to online registration 72.2% said NO to being required to use the system to pay for registration fees

Paying Transaction Fees

42.2% said players using the system should pay the fees

47.5% said the fees should be incorporated into the registration fees

Of players who are in favor of online registration 62.7% said the fees should be incorporated into the registration fees

Of the players that opposed online registration 90.4% said players using the system for payment should pay the transaction fees.

Notes

We have investigated a number of different systems to get the range of pricing. Implementing a system will incur costs beyond the payment transaction fees for each season.

If we implement a system, all players would need to minimally have to submit registration information online; however, payment options may include online and offline.

We would still be required to verify county residency which is unlikely to be done online.

We have yet to determine a specific registration process or system. It will require us to document the current process and identify the steps that can be done online versus what we'll still be required to do offline.

Comments

The comments are reported in the detailed finding for each question. There are a wide variety of replies and suggestions. They exemplify the diverse opinions of our membership.

There appears to be a couple of misconceptions.

1. Field Assignments/Saturday League

While FWSA started as a Saturday only league, several years ago **Fairfax County changed** the field allocation policy. When this happened we lost all Saturday fields but Pine Ridge. This is when the county started giving us evening slots on fields. FWSA did not decide to add evenings, we were forced to adapt to the policies of the county. We've been able to stay on Pine Ridge because we have adopted those fields and have paid for the maintenance of the fields.

2. Out-of County Fees

FWSA does not set the out-of-county fee. **The out of county fee is determined and set by the county.** FWSA is simply required to collect the fee and pass it back to the county. In addition, to the out-of-county fee, the league pays a \$5.50 user fee to the county per registration. Some may recall a while ago, the county wanted to make the user fee \$13.

DETAILED FINDINGS

FIELDS - Question 1

It would stink if we lose Saturday time, since we have put so much into those fields!
Another option if they push the night game start time back some is to shorten the games, maybe 35 minutes a half, so teams don't have to play too late
I prefer the early evening games rather than the later slots.
Perfer Saturday mornings/afternoon play.
evenings during the week work best for me
Evening games should start no later than 8:30pm. 9:15pm is too late for my schedule
I thought we had contributed some money to help turf the field. I suppoted that strongly as the fields are not in the best shape. I have marked my playing time preferences but would really like to increase the amount of time on turf.
but 9pm is a little late - i like 7 or 7:30 pm games at night
understand the needs of youth programs.
I also prefer that we not play 5 games over the course of 10 days (as we are with both of my teams now), the point was to play soccer once a week not finish a season as quickly as possible.
I am on other teams, I joined FWSA as a Saturday League. If it's not going to be a Saturday league, then at a minimum, pick only one additional day a week to play. I pay for other teams and each team counts on my attendance. When there are conflicts, it's not fair to anyone involved. FWSA needs to work on consistency.
Saturdays tend to work the best for me. An occasional weeknight game is doable.
Days are better for me because I work in the evenings and Saturday day hours are best for my committment. I don't mind splitting with the youth but most adults have to work during the week or take care of the youth.
wouldn't mind evening games on Thursday or Friday but 9:00 on a Monday Tues or Wed is a killer for work and sleep.
I'm not a fan of evenings but I know that it's hard to get daytime/weekend slots. Still, if there's any way to continue doing games on the weekends, it would be wonderful!
I would like more evenings than days.
To my knowledge FWSA has been paying to care for Pine Ridge fields for the last 10-15 years. It frusterates me that the county can dictate who has privilege use. Unless the county is paying for the upkeep, they shouldn't have a so-so in who gets to use it. Having said that. Pine Ridge fields need ALOT of work. They are probably the worse fields in the county. I prefer evenings most time because we get to use turf. But I still want Saturday DAY games.
7:30 (or possibly 8pm) games ON TURF are perfect. Anything later than that is too darn late -- most of us have jobs we need to be at the next morning and need our sleep!!! The ruty fields at Pine Ridge are dangerous -- we lost another player this past Saturday to a bad ankle injury because she stepped in a rut.
Didn't we help fund Pine Ridge Fields?? How can we not get Saturdays??
I specifically signed up for FWSA to play on Saturday during the day!!! With many of us being working mothers,

it is too hard to play in the evening.
Do NOT prefer playing later than 9pm any night.
I don't like Friday night games.
would be willing to switch to all evenings if all games could be on turf. Turf is the real preference over times.
Can we use WP M-F and only 7:30 games. Would it help if games were changed to 3- or 35 minute halves instead of 45 minutes. The 9:15 games are too late for any normal person
Prefer Tuesday evenings for GGM and Saturday's for GM
I prefer a mix of days and evenings as long as the games are not scheduled close together, and the evening games are not late games. If the games are placed close together or the evening games are late, I probably won't continue to play in the league.
I like evenings but not super-late evenings (game starts after 9:30 pm).
prefer days for the weekends, but evening - but not past starting at 9:15 on the week days. Most of us still have to get up for work the next day.
I like 9:15 weeknight games.
I don't really understand the question - "prefer days" must only refer to weekends, right? Most of us can't play days during the week. Likewise, "evenings" must refer to weekdays - I don't enjoy weekend evening games.
I'd like to be able to continue to play on Saturdays with 30+ at Pine Ridge and on weekdays with 50+ (starting at 7:30pm).
I especially hate Saturday afternoon games because they consume the entire day. 9 and 11 a.m. games are okay, but I'd rather play a 9:15 weeknight game instead.
school kid's should be home at 8pm
Weekend days
I prefer weeknight games over Saturdays
Prefer days on weekends, evenings during week.
I prefer late night games after my kids have their activities and are in bed ;-)
Games during the week should have start times before 9:30.
why are those of us without children punished for not having children? I too pay taxes -- a lot more taxes than those who get tax breaks for having kids.
This season we had 5 games in 10 days which was absolutely ridiculous. I was appalled that we had half the season over in less than two weeks. Also I prefer 7:30 games - not 9:00.
I do like the 7:30 games so only have 9:00 games would be a bummer.

I signed up for a Saturday league and that is what I hope will be able to continue. A league with all weeknight games, especially if they rotate days will be extremely difficult for me.

will be coaching
That's fine.
I am likely to play ONLY if the games are scheduled after 12:00 noon. I am not willing to miss church to play soccer on Sunday mornings. I hope this is taken into consideration.
Assuming we do not switch to a full Sunday league
I play in an indoor league Sunday nights and there's no way I could play a full outdoor game and then play indoor a few hours later.
Already play Arlington on Sundays.
Sundays would be GREAT
My kids all play travel soccer so no way could I play on Sunday
Would prefer no Sunday morning games. Sunday afternoon would be fine.
Only SUNDAY afternoon.
Except for holiday weekends, of course!
I would not play Sat and Sun the same weekend.
I coach a travel team and we play on Sundays.

FWSA members with children in travel programs may have trouble attending Sunday games.
Sunday afternoons will work for me. Church commitments will not let me play on Sunday morning.

Afternoon to evening times would be likely, but morning would not.I

1 pm would be the earliest time I could play b/c of church Sun morning.

Question 3 Comments (optional)

Yes, but it would be VERY DIFFICULT!!!!!!!!!!!!!! What are they thinking???????????????

I think we may lose players as a league, but it could help us gain players too. I think the mix is best-but we all are realizing our options may be limited.

My team has had all Saturday games this season and we have not been able to field a full team for any game Saturday

I also play indoor Wed night so I really do not want to play on 2 FWSA teams + indoor on weeknights. I would probably have to give up one of them.

can't play games that start at 9pm. ending games at 11 is too late since i get up for work at 5:30am every day

But my concern is that it will be hard to consistently field teams. we always have more players on saturday than in the evening. as it stands now there are multiple teams that require subs every weekend.

Would depend on my work schedule but would attempt to make as many games as possible.

Although I would stay on both teams, I expect that I would not be able to make as many games.

Only caveat here is where the games are played. If the games are at Wakefield, it's not a problem, but if all the games were held at Braddock or EC Lawrence, I might not be able to play given the distance (and traffic) to the fields.

Will only play in games starting by 8:30pm

depends on how far away the fields are but will make it when I can.

Strongly prefer to have some weekend games, either Sat or Sunday.

Many players play on multiple teams in different leagues. We've always been able to swing a "Saturday" league and a weeknight league. Switching to weeknights only is going to make it very difficult for many of us to play on multiple teams, which means LOSING PLAYERS.

If the evening hours are Saturday evening, yes. Not sure about other evenings.

Having only night games puts a stress on the family and the little time we have together during the week. It is very difficult to get to the later games too when you have to work the next morning.

I have other interests other than soccer. I probably could not manage two nights a week and would have to drop off one of the teams.

it depends on how late games are played. I don't want to be playing until midnight

Depending on the day of the week...it will conflict with my NNASA and Wed/Fri indoor teams.

I'll probably be able to play a fall season, but not spring -- I coach high school soccer and our practices are weekdays right after school ... going to a game of my own after that would be too much.

But if I got a slew of Monday (:00 games that would probably be my last season.

I am willing to sign up, BUT I know alot of my teammates travel and work far away to make it to evening games. I really hope FWSA is able to reschedule these games for Sunday afternoons, if Saturday DAY is unavailable. Atleast 50/50. Right now my team(s) have a 1 evening game and 1 Saturday day game. I hope FWSA is able to keep it that way, for those that can't make the week day games.

Yes, but on the stipulation that our games start at 7:30 or 8pm, and that they're evenly spread across the various turfed/lighted fields of Fairfax. 9pm or later starts are just too late. Games wouldn't finish until at least 10:30. And the drive from Wakefield to Herndon is too long to do every single week.

Would consider continuing to play but only if specific evening is designated to each division. Will likely not play

if division are not assignde a specific night to play.
Already have other committments during the week in the evenings, so would depend on scheduling.
We need to lobby for use of fields on Saturday I think it is crazy that it is even questionable that we can keep PR for Saturday!!!!
Back to back games or games with no rest day in between would be hard and I would probably have to drop one of my teams.
As long as the start time is before 9pm.
I play Arlington - 3 evening games a week is a lot and I don't like Friday night games.
single mom - just not sure how many night games I could do. I am already out of all 9:15 games. Problem is - you dont know what the schedule will be before you sign up and thats not fair to some people who are unable to play at night.
If they do that, are we entitled to other turfed fields at night?
Would depend upon conflicting schedules
I might continue to play but only if they are not late games.
Only if the evenings are spread out amongst the teams. I am TOO old to be playing soccer at 11:00 on a work night
Grandmasters currently has night time only so if it doesn't change - ok. I just don't like the real late games and have to work early next morning.
Most of my team is made up of mothers, so we struggle to field a team in the evenings. I suspect our team will fold if our games are scheduled for the evenings.
if I'll still make more than 1/2 the games bc of weekday games, yes. But I would not make any weekend evening games.
If the replacement games are still at Wakefield, okay. If we start playing on the other side of the county (i.e. more EC Lawrence games), then no.
My evening times are limited. I'd like to have some games on the weekends.
Weeknight games on the turf are great. Even better, could you schedule divisional games on a set night each week? i.e. Masters games would only be on Tuesdays or Thursdays as an example.
I have enough game conflicts during the week as it is.
it will depend on the conflicts with the other teams that I play on that currently are week nights.
if at Wakefield or on the turf field at Pine Ridge
more likely if it's Sunday evening
Most likley no. I play on other teams that play during the weekend night evenings and I already have several conflicts.
It would be very hard to commit to playing or making all the games if there were only evening hours.
But not if the playing times are later than 8:00
Depends on the times of the games, especially if they are during the workweek.
if they push back start time to all games to 9 pm, seems like no sat/sun and no games before 9 pm makes it pretty impossible to run a league
If we were to be limited to evening hours, can we have 7 PM and 8:45 PM weekend night slots? Starting after 9 PM is difficult.
This question seems a little too far either one way or the other. I think the better question would have been, if this change were to occur would it effect your schedule so much that you might not be able to play. I fit in the small minority with no children, but that doesn't mean I don't have an hour and a half commute to a job where I have to be there at 8am. As it is, the games at 9:15pm don't end til close to 11, by the time you sit on 495/66 (with all the repairs going on)..it was almost 11:40pm by the time I got home last Friday..I'm glad it was Friday and not a Monday night. It's a joke to think you can't play soccer at a more reasonable hour. We have just as much right as the kids have to the fields (again, I'm biased, I have no kids)..but to give all the more reasonable times to the kids and deny the adults usage (or until 9pm or later) isn't right. Aren't we the ones paying the taxes after all??? At some level too, at what point is safety a consideration. All of us are women, do I want to be walking to my car in a parking lot at 11pm or later? That's something else we all have to think about. If there are robberies from cars occuring at 7pm games, what happens when those games get moved to a later time?
9:15 games are a killer since I have to drive 30 min home and no one wants to play on Friday night.
I have regular commitments Mon-Thurs evenings. I would have a hard time making evening games if that was all we get.
Not on Mondays. Arlington always plays on Mondays.

Absolutely! Especially if these fields are all turf (WF5)
note response to #1. a switch to nights makes it much more likely I will stop playing.
Maybe because of possible conflicts playing in Arlington and indoor during the week.
the occasional nighttime game is Ok, but family life and work preclude nighttime play on a regular basis.
The kids have most of the fields on the weekends, and almost all practice on weeknights. They could use those practice field times for early games..starting between 5pm and 7:00pm.
It would create a lot more conflicts with my indoor team's schedule so would miss more games due to conflicts. Also would have more conflicts between games between 2 divisions in FWSA.
I prefer evening games.
I have very early job - wake up 5:00 a.m. so evening games are often just painful!
adults are the ones paying the bills, we should get some daytime hours too!
My 90% attendance would probably drop to less than 50% because getting my kids to and from their activities, getting the homework done and getting them to bed must be the first priority. For women who don't have kids or the kids are old enough to get themselves around, this wouldn't be as big an issue.
My determination is less about turf time than it is about remaining injury free.
I will continue to play, but of course will need to quit a team or two if we only play at night.

As a team rep I think that would be A LOT easier than trying to collect all the forms and checks
I'm a team rep and it would definitely be easier for me!
Seems great, but I was surprised the cost would be what it is. Would it be feasible to offer an internet registration process with a mail in feature for payment?
FINALLY!!!!!!!
not if it means paying even more
I like that it would reduce burden on volunteer staff, but \$5-8 per registration is too high. It seems each year we're tacking on a new fee. Only if \$2 or less would it interest me, and/or if we got to the point that no one would volunteer specifically b/c registration processing was too hard. (which seems unlikely).
I don't care at all and don't want to pay extra for on-line.
As team rep, I guess the question I ask myself "Is it worth \$8 for me not to have to handle registrations." Put that way the answer is "yes."
Now it takes too long for a check to clear from the time they are given to the team rep until they are processed.
As a team rep, it is a lot easier to get my folks registered if I have some control. I will lose all control/leverage if the registration is completely up to the individual.
I'm already paying out of county fees since I'm no longer a Fairfax resident, to have it increase more... costs are too high already for a season...
would everyone have to pay the extra \$\$ or only those who register on-line?
Only if it is optional rather than mandatory.
If this registration didn't also then involve mailing in proof of county status, which would eliminate the convenience of the on-line aspect
If there is a fee, I am not interested in the online registration. I will continue to pay by check so I will not incur the fee.
It doesn't matter to me.
More fees?
The cost doesn't seem to be worth it.
I believe FWSA should start requiring players to carry PLAYER PASSES like they do in the Northern Va league. Since FWSA has gone to a sub pool, this should be even MORE of a priority, as teams have NO way of knowing if the subs are PAYING players. This may help make up for the \$5-8 increase if ON-LINE registration occurs.
I know it would be easier but I don't really want to pay more.
Really don't want to pay more. For those of us out of county, the fee would be ~\$100 a session
I prefer paying by check. I have to mail in a proof of residency anyway so it's just as easy to include the check and the reg form too. That way everything is together in one envelope.
although the cost for out of county players is already pretty high
When there are dual registrations, would there only be one transaction fee?
Seems like it would be added trouble. More burden would be placed on the league officers rather than the team reps. Is the current process a problem?
its expensive enough. now it only costs me a stamp to send it in.
Been interested for many years!!
If costs could be kept to a minimum and it's beneficial to the league. If hard copy is required as a backup, it's

not worthwhile.
I am not interested in paying additional fees for this function.
I don't have a strong preference, it is convenient online but I am mindful of the extra cost as well.
It is 2010, not 1990
as long as it's a secure site
I don't like the additional \$5-8 fee.
In this day and age - you need to make registering user friendly for the Team managers. Also, being able to use your credit card is easier than asking people to mail checks... that's like pulling hen's teeth. ;)

I'd rather buy an envelope + stamp and mail than spend an extra \$5-\$8.

The cost to FWSA is probably less the more people use the system.
several out of county players are already paying \$99 per season. they should have the option to register by paper. i think you have to have both.
If it's easier, charge a fee for those that don't do online...could go to funds to help us acquire fields.
Phasing in an online registration system over a couple of seasons, rather than requiring 100% participation immediately would help the transition of one system to another. Eventually, I think having online registration (only) is appropriate.
provide paper option for those without an IP (Internet access)
It would seem in your best interest to be an all or nothing sort of venture, otherwise you don't get the efficiencies.
I assume that all have access to a computer, but to be able to make this a widely available service/system, you'd need to plan for a back-up. That might be as easy as the captain having to register for a player who is unable to do so on his/her own - but it needs to be all inclusive and considered.

Background on FWSA Fields

The fields at Pine Ridge are being lighted later this spring. Field #4 is being turfed by the county.

Fairfax County's most recently adopted field policy states that youth teams have priority use of all fields during the daytime hours until 8 pm at night. This applies to week days and week ends. We have Wakefield at 7:30 pm because we helped fund that field. Some youth groups are apparently lobbying to push back the 8 PM use to 9 PM.

We've continued to have the fields at Pine Ridge on Saturday's despite the usage policy because youth teams have not wanted to use the non-turfed fields. Minimally, FWSA will lose Saturday daytime hours on #4 and possibly on #5 and #6. We may not get evening hours on #4 after it is turfed.

Over the last several seasons FWSA's field allocation has roughly been 50% evenings and 50% days on Saturdays.

B. ONLINE REGISTRATION

There are a variety of solutions available to do online registrations (replacing our paper registration forms and offering online payment options). In general the costs include the system and transaction fees (credit cards/paypal processing).

These costs are \$5-\$8 per player per registration each season in additional cost on top of the normal registration fee. A portion of this fee would be the payment transaction fee.
